

Programming

The Notre Dame Upper School emphasizes functional academics with the addition of vocational training, job site placement and independent living components.

Bridges Program (Ages 15-18)

The Bridges Program is designed to meet the unique academic and social needs of adolescents with developmental disabilities.

- Students explore their career interests and begin to develop the independent living skills that will help them to live and work in their communities.
- They participate in community training and job exploration at off campus sites at least twice a week. In addition, they continue with their functional academics in reading, math and social studies during the morning.



FACTS GRANT & AID




THE HALO INITIATIVE

Students at diocesan schools (Bishop Dunne, Bishop Lynch, and JPII) are eligible for Financial Aid through The HALO Initiative, which coordinates local funding for Diocese of Dallas Catholic Schools. The application for tuition assistance opens in FACTS on November 1, 2022. Students currently enrolled in a Diocesan Catholic School may apply by January 5, 2023 to be considered for priority funding. All students including new students must apply by April 1, 2023 to be considered.
